Maximizing your potential as a deafened person - Utilising Audiology Services and Improving your employment opportunities.

The conference will be opened by Lilian Greenwood MP. Speakers include Prof David Welbourn (CEO BSHAA), Jane Cordell (www.gettingequal.com), Dr Sue Archbold, Lisa Baldock MBE, Mohammed Butt (Oticon).

The morning session will cover the Person Centred Approach advocated by **NHS England's Action Plan on Hearing Loss**, looking from the perspective of audiology, the hearing aid manufacturer and the Cochlear Implant program. It will also include a presentation of the preliminary results of **NADPs Audiology Survey**.

The afternoon session will look at the changing employment market for deaf people based on DWP publication **What Works: Employment**. We look at strategies being put in place to assist deafened people in employment and those seeking new opportunities including the development of the **disability passport** in the civil service.

Both morning and afternoon sessions will conclude with a panel discussion. **Communication Support** provided by STTR (Speech to Text), Lipspeaker with sign and Hearing Loop.

There will also be practical demonstrations of assistive equipment and stands by supportive services during lunch and tea breaks.

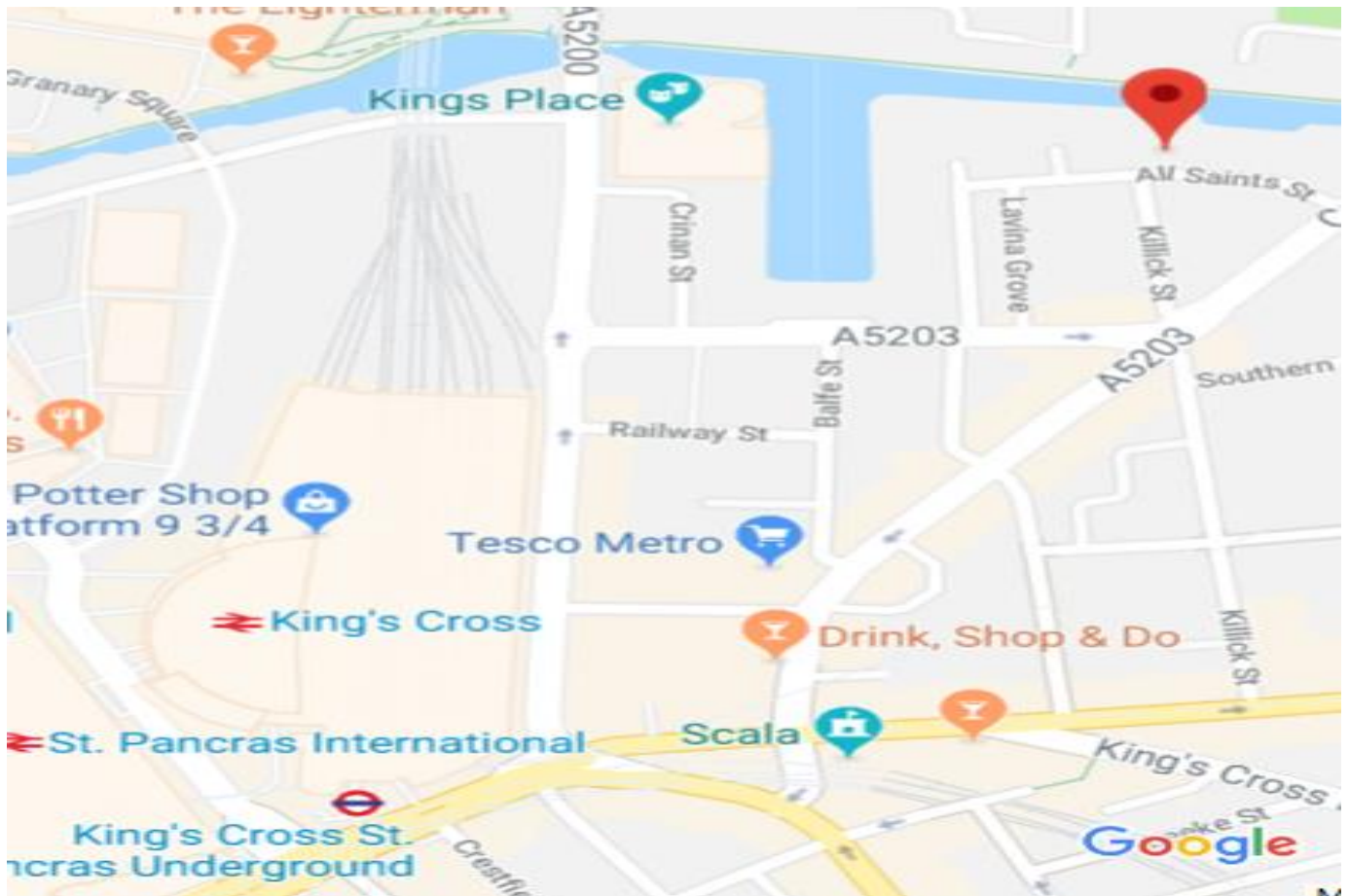

An estimated 6 million people visited the 1851 Great Exhibition housed in the Crystal Palace erected in Hyde Park. The enormous success produced a substantial profit so the Royal Commission used the surplus to purchase an estate of 87 acres in South Kensington. Prince Albert's ambition was to "*extend the influence of science and art upon productive industry*" which led to the establishment of the Science Museum, National History Museum and the Victoria & Albert Museum.

We will explore the area they are housed, appreciate their exterior architecture and discover the fascinating stories of these museums as they developed into three of the world's outstanding museums.
